Background Information

DEONACH (Tallaght Probation Project) is a community-based voluntary/charity organisation which supports participants to reduce the frequency and gravity of their offending and transition towards safe, successful and fulfilling lives in their communities. Deonach helps people to stabilise their lives, adopt a pro-social lifestyle, and build their personal capacity to progress towards their goals in a sustainable way. The Project has grown significantly since its establishment in 1995, to a point where it now provides a broad range of services from its premises in Tallaght.

DEONACH is a company with charitable status. It is primarily funded by the Probation Service, with additional support from Dublin Dun Laoghaire ETB. The Management Committee is made up of volunteers and individuals from a range of statutory and voluntary organisations that represent the diverse needs of participants. Deonach works in close partnership with the Probation Service and other agencies to best meet the presenting needs of participants and the community.

The Project provides a service to two distinct target groups:

- (a) Young people (aged 15-18 and 18-25) who are subject to a Probation Order.
- (b) Adults: The majority are subject to a Probation order or have been involved in offending behaviour. There is no upper age limit, participants typically range in age from 18 to 60 years.

- Develop desistance programmes and early intervention programmes that facilitate the participants to explore the impact of their offending on the victim, their community and themselves

- To undertake restorative and reparative programmes for community engagement and re-integration
- Create and nurture strategic partnerships which allow more effective and efficient use of resources and opportunity to achieve our Purpose.

Terms and Conditions of Employment

Salary Scale: The candidate will be registered with ETB and salary is in line with Tutor/Teacher salary scales

Contractual basis: The post is offered on a One-year fixed term Part Time contract basis and is subject to a probationary period. 8 hours per week x 48 weeks per year.

Holiday entitlement: In line with ETB annual leave entitlements

- the post is 8 hours per week, and payment is on a class-contact hours basis and appointees will not be paid during school closures.
- co-operation hours posts are part time, payment is on an hourly class-contact basis, they are not RPT (pro-rata salaried).
- teachers will receive holiday pay (based on number of class-contact hours delivered) in three annuities over the school year (at Christmas, Easter and Summer)
